
INFORMATION ABOUT FEMERN A/S'S PROCESSING OF YOUR PERSONAL DATA IN CONNECTION WITH CCTV SURVEILLANCE

Please find information below about how we process your personal data in connection with CCTV surveillance at Work Harbour Lolland.

In compliance with Article 14 of the General Data Protection Regulation the information has been made public on our website, cf. Article 14(5)(b).

1. We are the data controller - how to contact us?

Femern A/S ("Femern", "we" or "us") is the data controller for the processing of the personal data in connection with CCTV surveillance.

3. The objectives of and the legal basis for the processing of your personal data

As the owner of Tunnel harbour Rødbyhavn, Femern also has the role of port authority. Reference is made to the Executive Order on the Regulations for Tunnel harbour Rødbyhavn: <https://femern.com/da/tunnel-havn/rodbyhavn/>.

As the owner of Tunnel Harbour Rødbyhavn, Femern has the overall responsibility for the International Ship and Port Security (ISPS) and emergency response regarding the contact to the relevant authorities.

An important part of performing the tasks regarding the above responsibilities includes being able to visually monitor activities in the harbour covering the harbour basin, access channel and berths.

We process your personal data in compliance with the Danish TV Surveillance Act. The processing of your personal data is based on Article 6(1)(e) of the General Data Protection Regulation in compliance with section 44 of the Construction Act for the Fixed Link across the Fehmarnbelt and the Danish Landworks 2015.

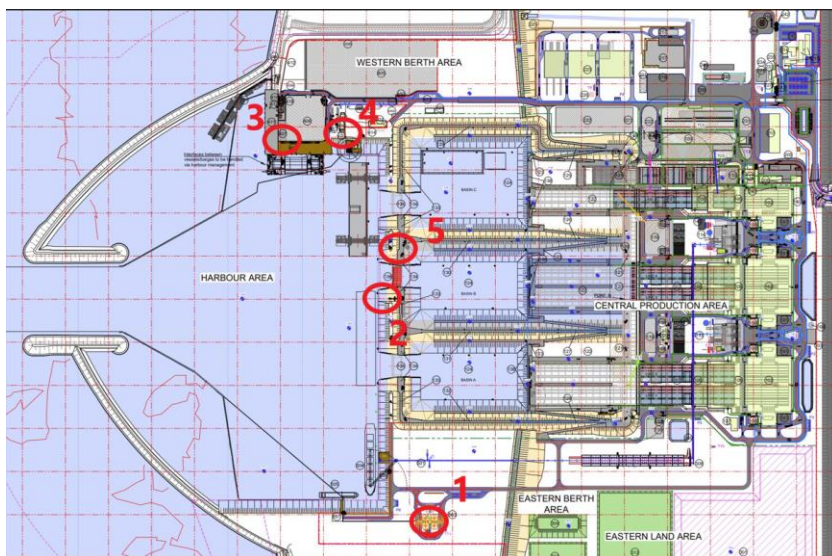
If you have given us information about any criminal offences, our processing is based on section 8(1) and (2)(3) of the Danish Data Protection Act.

4. The categories of personal data

We process data about you from the CCTV surveillance from the monitored area. For example:

- General personal data such as the time of your presence in the monitored area.
- Any criminal offences and violations of the law if you engage in criminal activities in the monitored area.

5. Potential locations of CCTV cameras



- Location 1 – At the top of a cement silo
Location 2 – At the base of PEL (port entry light)
Location 3 – At the corner of TUX and owner's berth
Location 4 – On the roof of the port office
Location 5 – On the erected (and possibly temporary) mast

The indicated CCTV's positions are indicative and the MAP with positions will be updated.

6. Recipients of your personal data

The CCTV surveillance is a “live view”. No recordings will therefore be stored and your personal data will not be passed on. Only a system operator will be able to access the live CCTV surveillance to ensure operation.

7. Retention of your personal data

Recordings of the surveillance will be stored and deletion deadlines will be established in compliance with the principle of storage limitation of Article 5(1)(e) of the General Data Protection Regulation. Recordings with personal data originating from surveillance for crime prevention purposes shall generally be deleted 30 days after they have been recorded. cf. Section 4 c (4) in the Surveillance Act. In special cases, where it is necessary for the sake of a specific dispute or pursuant to Section 4 c (2) of the Surveillance Act, the recording may be retained for a longer period, cf. Section 4 c (5) in the Surveillance Act.

8. Your rights

Under the General Data Protection Regulation, you have several rights regarding our processing of your personal data. If you wish to exercise your rights, please contact us.

In accordance with the principle of data minimisation of Article 5(1)(c) of the General Data Protection Regulation, the processing of your personal data will be limited in the form of live monitoring only.

As we do not record for storage but only have live monitoring, the possibility of exercising your rights under Chapter III in the General Data Protection Regulation will be limited to information about how we process personal data.

Right to object

In certain cases, you have the right to object to Femern’s lawful processing of your personal data.
